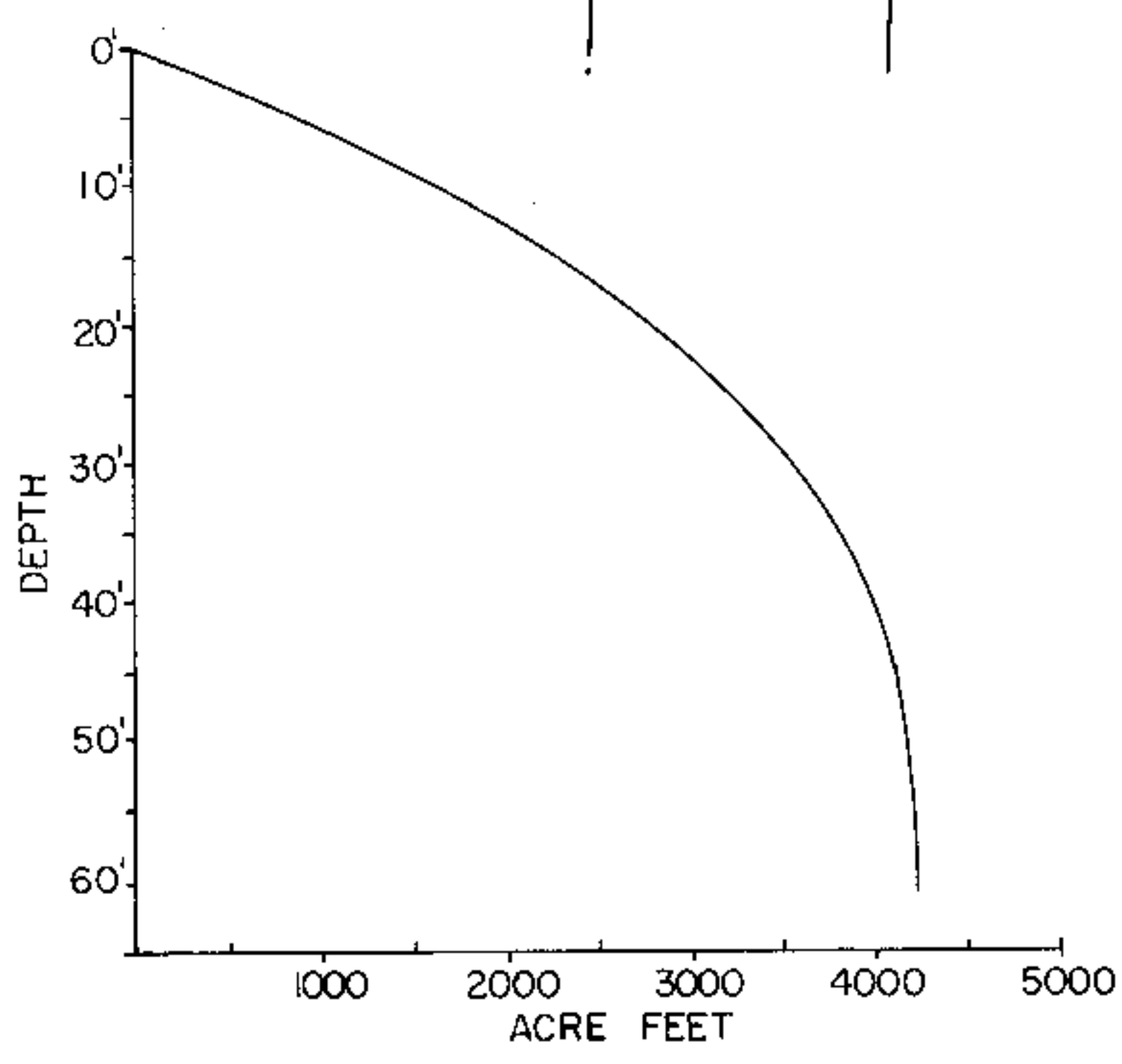


BM. X' 1404-A Located on Middle Sugarbush
